C4E Kickoff Meetings & Open House

C4E held its official kickoff meetings on January 16 (at C4E HQ) and February 9 (online version), both of which were well attended with representatives from across all units of campus.

The C4E team outlined the current strategy for building community and collaborations through the C4E, and Associate Provost for Climate and Sustainability Programming Kevin Reed described his plans to develop new approaches to graduate programs in climate and sustainability. This academic year the C4E is focused on offshore wind, and the group discussed a range of activities that are being organized around the topic of offshore wind, including our first annual debate and integration into Spring 2023 undergraduate reading and writing courses. The C4E is building out a series of events to facilitate connections on campus and with the local community with an eye towards fostering the kind of interdisciplinary collaborations that will be required to solve the major environmental challenges of the 21st century.


