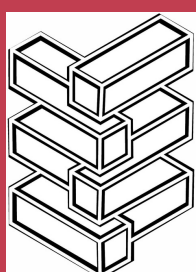

North Korea has followed a unique path based on its distinctive history, cultural legacy and political development. Under the third-generation of the Kim family regime North Korea is changing in sometimes surprising ways, both in its domestic society and in its relations to the outside world.

He has published widely on modern Korea, East Asia, and US-East Asia relations and is a frequent commentator on Asian affairs in the US and international media.
